

SOFTWARE RELEASE POLICY

Redline software releases are classified into the following three groups:

1 Roadmap Major/Minor Feature Release

Roadmap releases are scheduled as part of Redline's product development and include planned features, new functionality, performance improvements and known issues. Roadmap releases are typically scheduled to occur on a semi-annual basis.

2 Maintenance & Security Roll-Up Release

Maintenance releases focus on resolving minor issues identified in previous versions of software, fixes to recently-identified minor security vulnerabilities and incremental improvements to system stability and performance. These releases generally do not include significant new functionality. Maintenance releases are typically scheduled to occur on a quarterly basis (may be merged with a coincident Roadmap Release).

3 Targeted Security Release

Security is an ever-present concern in the industry and new issues and vulnerabilities in platforms, libraries, and systems can be detected at any time. When a relevant security vulnerability is identified, Redline immediately notifies and works with affected customers to minimize risk and identify any additional procedures required until the issue can be resolved. Targeted security releases are unscheduled and issued as-needed depending on the severity of the vulnerability. If issue is low severity/urgency, the fix may be merged with a coincident Maintenance or Roadmap Release.
